


### Q1 Which Resolution would you prefer to see the Commissioners pass on Tuesday July 7th 2015? Do you have things that you would like to see modified in either draft?







### Q4 Which Commissioner do you think best represents the concerns of the citizens to help protect American Fork Canyon?








