Dear County Commissioners and Dave Whittekiend,

I'm a resident of Utah County (Alpine, UT) and have been participating in local grass roots meetings (i.e. Fox Hollow Golf Course gathering w/ local citizens and Snowbird CEO) regarding "potential" expansion of Snowbird into Utah county. In the meeting I attended recently there appears to be a lot of fear, uncertainty and doubt being raised by local citizens with respect to Snowbird "taking over" American Fork Canyon.

As an avid outdoorsman who rides his bike weekly in AF Canyon and who has skied at Snowbird for 20+ years, I believe there is common ground that can be found to support the many residents who want to protect the environment of the canyon AND continue to have easy access to lift served ski terrain in our mountains.

Tomorrow, a number of UT county citizens will be coming to the county commissioners to argue AGAINST Snowbird acquiring 416 acres connecting property very far from American Fork canyon. I am out of town on business and cannot attend these meetings so I would like to express my opinion to you that these land swap between existing land that Snowbird owns has nothing to do with impeding on recreation or the environment of American Fork Canyon, nor on any plans to build some tram 5 miles from Tibblefork to Snowbird. The current desire is for Snowbird to link existing lands they own to enable a better skiing experience for all of us.

I don't believe Snowbird wants to "take over" American Fork canyon in any way. My experience has been the opposite with respect to Snowbird. I have never been banned to hike, ride my bike or recreate on their land in Mineral Basin. I have found that since the expansion of their resort, there has been "less" motorized vehicles in the area and erosion

has diminished by the improvements Snowbird has made on these lands. Having a responsible steward of these lands has gone a long way to prevent environmental damage to these lands by weekend 4 wheeler recreationalists who damage trails.

Having the ability to access Snowbird (if is available by future plans and approved environmental impact studies) would be a great thing for people who want to access Snowbird via American Fork canyon. It would cut down on pollution in both Utah and Salt Lake Counties by enabling fewer cars on the highways and would resemble other beautiful linked ski areas in Europe that have gondolas or trams that connect canyons. We cannot burry our heads in the sand that more people want/need access to the mountains and just ban Snowbird from expansion.

I would rather have an gondola connecting our canyons than 4-wheel drive vehicles scarring up our land—which is currently happening on UT county lands in AF canyon due to the current hands-off approach to our mountains in the area. I would encourage each of you to participate in the Mountain Accord meetings where you will see a balanced approach to development and preservation of our lands.

Commissioner Graves,

Thank you for your reply.

What items should be given consideration in my view.

First and foremost an *immediate moratorium of development or land trade decisions in American Fork Canyon until the following have been thoroughly vetted.* The Mountain Accord process was thorough, Utah County processes deserve the same level of care.

- #1. Full land inventory of private lands in American Fork Canyon
- #2. Understanding of what mine tailings, and potential hazards, heavy metals, arsenic, etc. might be associated with individual mining claims. Basically a pedigree of each mine and if there are hazards with soil that need to be protected. Think Animas river, think Tibble Fork sludge, think prior Snowbird clean up efforts and Bob Bonars comments about existing hazards in the canyon. Do we really want any form of development even considered before we understand costs, risks, etc.?
- #3. Update the County GIS map so that a clear understanding is available to the Commissioners as to the scope of public / private land in A. F. Canyon.
- #4. Appraisals of private land holdings in A.F. Canyon. / Analysis of hazards of mining talings /
- #5. Establish a American Fork Canyon Alliance with the following considerations.
- A- Lay citizens invite trusted business leaders and trusted elected officials to participate at a ratio of 1:1:1.
- B- Perhaps some entities are voting members, some are merely advisory members- remembering that the government works for the people, not the other way around. This is often confused in todays political realm.
- #6. Public and open meetings, at a minimum of one meeting per Utah County city. Meetings are recorded, broadcast live and recorded. Following the pattern established by Mountain Accord.
- #7. Public input taken into consideration over the span of the time necessary to hold public meetings and to inform local citizens. Broad outreach via press, social media and presentations.
- #8 American Fork Canyon Alliance to then consider aggregated suggestions, followed by formal recommendations, vote on these considerations / recommendations and follow the same pattern established by Mountain Accord, by way of signing an alliance.

#9. At this juncture, land swap negotiations and or cost / benefit / hazard analysis would be clearly understood.

Shortcuts to the above process would be less than the resource dictates, than the citizens of the county deserve, in my opinion.

I will post this to our PPAFC page to see if anyone from our group would have other items for consideration.

I sure look forward to that. It seems there isn't any real direction on where this is going from here, at least in the publics eye. We have thousands wanting to know what discussions have been had and what is in discussion now, what is the next step, and how they can get involved. I look forward to an open, transparent process that has a similar time table as the Mountain Accord had on their blueprint for the Middle Wasatch from I-80 to the ridge top of Little Cottonwood Canyon. It would be beneficial to have a statement from our county commissioners and Forest Service, whom Mountain Accord turned over all negotiations with lands pertaining to snowbird land swaps and other possible developments in American Fork Canyon on a regular basis and not keep the public hanging. I don't believe a single public meeting has been held since the July 13 vote with Mountain Accord.

Will there be a task force or steering committee called to address land use/swaps in American Fork Canyon?

How will this task force be chosen?

Will their decision be binding or just a recommendation?

What kind of protections will be put in place to protect and preserve the canyon in a way the majority of the public wish?

Will there be a moratorium put in place in American Fork Canyon to assure due diligence can take place before any other action will be taken on land swaps, development, exchanges?



Question 7: What events led to the AFC Vision project?

A: The first major event that led to what is now the AFC Vision process was an informal proposal from Snowbird Resort to expand resort operations in the upper reaches of American Fork Canyon near Mineral Basin. The process for preparing an application to initiate a "proposal" that can be considered in NEPA is outlined at 36 CFR 251.54(g). If an applicant desires to occupy or use National Forest System lands, it is their responsibility to initiate the process formally. NEPA begins when an agency develops a proposal to address a need to take an action.





Figure 1: Mt. Superior Ridgeline

"The need to take an action may be something the agency identifies itself, or it may be a need to make a decision on a proposal brought to it by someone outside of the agency, for example, an applicant for a permit. Based on the need, the agency develops a proposal for action (Number 1 in Figure 1). If it is the only Federal agency involved, that agency will automatically be the "lead agency," which means it has the primary responsibility for compliance with NEPA. (A citizen's guide to NEPA, CEO 2007).

Forest Service Handbook 1909.15, Chapter 12.24 clarifies further: "The responsible official shall make policies or staff available to advise potential applicants of studies or other information foreseeably required for acceptance of their applications. Upon acceptance of an application as provided by 36 CFR 251.54(g) the responsible official shall initiate the NEPA process. (36 CFR 220.4(i))...The responsible official may require project proponents to conduct studies and provide data and documentation for consideration and use in preparing an EIS."

State and local governments began to consider Snowbird's ideas, and quickly realized the requirement to consider Snowbird's questions in the context of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). Recognizing the substantial cost of doing and environmental impact statement under NEPA, they requested \$500,000 in funding from the Utah State Legislature in 2014. The Legislature did not fund the full request, but instead allocated \$100,000 to undertake a higherlevel public "Vision" to consider a broader range of questions in the canyon, and to engage the public far in advance of developing funding for a specific NEPA project. The second major event was developing the scope of the Vision, and the goals and principles to be followed. These were built into an RFP: (http://web.mountainland.org/site/webroot/images/upload/files/American% 20Fork%20Canyon%20Vision%20RFP%20DRAFT.pdf), and a neutral, third-party facilitator was chosen (Buck Swaney with Logan Simpson) to help create a long-term public vision for land use

and recreation in the Canvon.

The Mountainland Association of Governments (Mayors and County Commissioners in Summit, Wasatch, and Utah counties) used the legislative appropriation to fund the facilitator's contract. The Vision is now being run to develop high-level policy direction for dealing with private land proposals, public land management, and environmental, recreation, and other needs in the project area.

This Project is scheduled to continue through January of 2016.

Proposed Cottonwood Canyons Scenario for Public Consideration

The Cottonwood Canyon Task Force has negotiated a recommendation for a package of landuse protections and adjustments in Big and Little Cottonwood Canyons. The recommended actions would provide key public benefits by permanently protecting iconic landscapes and ridgelines from development (Figure 1), preserving important backcountry areas for dispersed recreation, and increasing environmental and watershed protections.

Under this recommendation, the four Cottonwood Canyon Ski Areas, local and federal government partners, and conservation and outdoor interests would partner to preserve, for public benefit, about **2,150** acres of Ski-Area owned lands in the Cottonwood Canyons (Figure 2). At the headwaters of Little Cottonwood Canyon, preserved lands would include the areas of Mt. Superior, Flagstaff, Emma Ridge, Grizzly Gulch (under consideration), and White Pine. At the headwaters of Big Cottonwood Canyon, the preserved lands would include Ski Area holdings in the Guardsman Pass, Cardiff/Days Fork, and Hidden Canyon areas.

In return for placing these land holdings into public ownership and protection, the Ski Areas would propose and benefit from:

- Station stops on a mountain-rail system which would provide reliable, fast, unique, and marketable transit to the resorts and to major dispersed recreation access points. The canyon road would still be open to vehicular traffic.
- 2. Approximately 258 acres for base-area management and future development (with new culinary water for up to 108 units at Alta) to support activity at transit stops.
- 3. Additional water for snowmaking.
- Ski permit boundary expansions of 210 acres (140 in Hidden Canyon, 70 in lower Silver Fork).
- Approximately 416 acres in American Fork Canyon.

The protective aspects of this recommendation address critical components of Mountain Accord's proposed actions, including widespread watershed and environmental protections outlined in the goals and metrics of the environment and recreation system groups. The Ski Area and transportation aspects of this proposal would potentially align with the goals and metrics of the economy and transportation system groups.

SUMMARY

Much has been accomplished under the hood since we began work in October. The public part of visioning has been coordinated with development and deployment of the USU/USFS visitor intercept surveys, which contain Vision-related questions. MAG and LSD have agreed to a project completion date for January 2016 to allow the Vision to be informed by the results of the survey. We think this will lead us to a better understanding of canyon use and public values, and to a stronger vision and action plan. Below is a summary of major tasks completed over the past quarter.

OCTOBER

MAG and LSD agreed to slow the formal public rollout of the public or "town-hall" part of the Vision work. For that month, we instead agreed to:

- Hold an initial Steering Committee (SC) Kickoff to begin developing framework of project goals and expectations. (KICKOFF DONE – ADDITIONAL MEETING NEEDED)
- 2. Prepare the project logo and branding, website, and public commenting interfaces. (DONE, visit www.afcvision.com)
- Attend the two MAG transportation open houses (Orem and American Fork) and have a booth, display, and public outreach. (DONE)
- Develop a Vision component for the intercept survey questions that supports our project specifically. (DONE)
- Begin developing a stakeholder interview list to develop direct contact and gain information from government partners and other stakeholders through early January, when we will start formal public visioning activities. (MADE INITIAL LIST; INTERVIEWS IN JAN)
 - Talk with Steering Committee about locations one at Snowbird, one at Cedar Hills, and possibly one in a location TBD. (NEED SC MTG; SCHEDULE PUBLIC MTGS)



NOVEMBER

MAG and LSD agreed to the following tasks:

- 1. Update the content of the website. (MOSTLY DONE; NEED SC APPROVAL)
- 2. Develop the vision document's conceptual structure. (DONE; NEED SC APPROVAL)
- 3. Collaborate with MAG/USU/USFS on survey design and delivery methods (DONE)

DECEMBER

- Began development of an AFC Vision PowerPoint which will be used as a key PR tool for ET members. (FIRST DRAFT REVIEWED; SECOND DRAFT IN DEVELOPMENT)
- Developed newspaper article for full year-long publication in the <u>Reflections</u> newspaper that is distributed in American Fork Canyon by USFS and NPS. (DONE - THE AFC VISION WILL BE FRONT PAGE NEWS THROUGH ALL OF 2015).
- Developed a fully updated schedule and work plan using the new January 2016 final date. (DONE - NEED TO REVIEW WITH SC).

NEXT STEPS

The key to-do's right now (mostly for January) include:

- 1. Hold a meeting with the Steering Committee to:
 - a. Review the new schedule and the proposed vision structure and design;
 - b. Convene a Steering Committee meeting to build our consensus/conflict picture. We began this conversation at the Cedar Hills golf course meeting but didn't go deep enough. We need to be clear about the difficult questions we will be tackling together (e.g., National Monument, Ski-area expansions, etc.)
- 2. Complete stakeholder interviews.
- 3. Schedule and hold public Visioning events.
- 4. Develop a schedule of Steering Committee meetings for reporting and collaboration.

Thank you for your guidance. We have laid a solid groundwork and have been careful to conserve budget while coordinating with the survey schedule. Please let me know if you'd like anything added to our next steps, or if you need more information on what's reported here. I look forward to major activity in January, both with you all personally and with the public.


